Restoring the clock from St. Luke's Church, Cradley Heath





When we knew St. Luke's was going to be lost, we enquired about saving the clock for use at St. Peter's.

When the tower was built in 1875 a space was left for a clock to be added. Due to lack of funds this has never been done.






This bell was saved and is now at St John's Church, Northington in Hampshire where they have increased the ring of three bells to six using other salvaged bells.











Thanks to the help of Luke Perry and the demolition contractors, the clock was removed in November 2016 and transported to St Peter's.

Unfortunately, when the clock was removed, part of the cast iron dial broke away. All the parts are together with the dial and advice has been sought to confirm that repair is possible.



We would like to restore and repair the clock dial from St. Luke's and place it on the tower at St. Peter's.

The dial would be repainted, gilded with gold leaf and the glass replaced.





We would like to install a replica weathervane and place it on the tower.

The weathervane would be made to this design, painted black and gilded with gold leaf. It will be accompanied by a flagpole in the north-east corner.

The original weathervane and flagpole were removed in the mid 20th century.



There are five parts to our project

- 1. The restoration and installation of the clock and dial
 - £8,000.
- 2. The installation of chimes on the bells £7,000.
- 3. Installation of tower floodlighting £6,000.
- 4. Manufacture and installation of a replica weathervane £5,000.
- 5. Installation of a flagpole on the tower £3,000.
- 6. Installation of a lightning protection system £3,000.
